Users can then scroll through the resources listed or use the search box at the top of each publication page and type in the title of what you are looking for or an applicable search term.

Example: a homeowner interested in retrofitting their home to protect themselves from the flooding risks posed by hurricane could navigate to the Hurricane Publications page, type in a search term such as *home* or *homeowner* to find *FEMA P-312: Homeowner's Guide to Retrofitting (3rd Edition)*.

Note: users cannot make use of Boolean logic to refine their searches or multiple search terms.
